For the first two weeks in January, we'll be talking about *Winter*. First, we will read and use our own senses to learn about ice and how it melts, and make icy and snowy art. We'll pretend and sing about all the fun things we can do in the snow, such as sledding and building snowmen. Then, in the second week, we'll use songs and puppets to talk about what bears and other animals do in the winter.

We'll continue to play or walk outside whenever possible, so be sure to send along those warm coats, hats and mittens labeled with your child's name on cold days. We'll get the New Year started with a week of PJ's and Teddy Bears. We'll bring our favorite Teddys to school and see if we can teach them to dance! On another day, we will wear our pajamas to school! Our next theme is Wintery Fun. If the weather cooperates we can investigate the science of freezing and thawing. If it doesn't we can make up for it with our own winter activities indoors. The last theme of the month is so huge it needs two weeks – DINOSAURS! They will be all over the school – stomping across the art table, peeking out of the books, climbing our "dinosaur mountain" and lurking in the sensory table. What's not to love about those terrible lizards!?

Two important events occur in January, so mark your calendars. I will set aside time on January 11<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> for Parent/Teacher Conferences. This will give us a few uninterrupted moments to talk about your students, how they are doing and goals for the rest of the year. Look for sign-up sheets on the check-in table. Then on Wednesday the 18<sup>th</sup>, PNS will hold its annual Open House to show off our school to prospective families for next year. We will have a normal school day while our visitors come see all the great stuff we do!

What's a cow's favorite holiday?

...Mooo-Year's Eve



Welcome back and Happy New Year! I hope all the three/fours and their families had a memorable, restful break and that everyone's special wishes came true! Now winter has settled in around us, it's time to get back to school. My planbook is full of ideas to help us beat the winter blues. During the first week of January, we will have lots of winter excitement as each child discovers what makes winter so unique...and FUN! We'll have the opportunity to create some pretty cool "snowy" art. (I hope you like glitter!) We'll also concentrate on learning the difference between mittens and gloves! Then we're off to talk about polar animals (1/9). Penguins, polar bears, and snowy owls will make appearances during our circletime. And our table work will be very wild and exciting!! ☺ Dinosaurs will roam PNS beginning on the 17th. Be very prepared for lots of prehistoric action! How many types of dinosaurs can you name? I bet your kids will be able to identify many types before the month is over! Then we will don our paleontologist hats starting on the 23<sup>rd</sup> as we discover and learn about dinosaur bones and fossils. From tiny dinosaurs and gravel in our sensory table to painting our very own dinosaur rock eggs, the excitement runs high. There is no more popular unit in a preschooler's educational experience! On the 30<sup>th</sup>, we will move from thinking about dino bones to human bones as we begin reviewing our own body parts...head, shoulders, knees, and toes...and all that kind of thing. There will be a lot of movement going on in our classroom...it's a very active week!

There are several dates that need to be written in your new 2017 calendars. Conferences will take place on Wednesday, January 11<sup>th</sup> and Thursday, January 12<sup>th</sup>. This will be a time when I will meet with each of you to discuss your child's social, emotional, cognitive, and physical development. After the first of the year, I will send out a Sign-Up Genius for you to make your choice of conference time. I will also be sending out a note asking if there is anything specific that you would like to discuss during our time together. Also remember that there is no school on the 16<sup>th</sup> (MLK Day) and the 20<sup>th</sup> (Inauguration Day)...both FCPS holidays. We WILL be in school on Wednesday, January 18<sup>th</sup> during the PNS Open House. The Open House will be going on all around us, but we will be having a regular school day.

When you coop this month, you will notice several classroom management changes. At the beginning of the month, the sign-in board will just have name tags to move...the colored symbols have been retired. Then the BIG transformation will occur about mid-month. The sign-in board will disappear totally and a new response board will take its place. Every morning a "Question of the Day" will be presented...and the kids will each get to answer it by moving their name to their chosen response.

This activity serves two purposes...each student must recognize his/her name to "vote" a response, and then each child must make an individual decision about a specific question. I will also be phasing in more free choice during small-motor time first thing in the morning. The kids will be able to choose the toy that they want to play with (right from the cabinet!) instead of me making the choice for them. They will take the toy to the table or floor to play...and then return it to the cabinet by themselves before making another choice. The Monday gang has been doing this for several weeks, and I am counting on them to model the correct behavior for the rest of the group. It is one more way for this group to become even more independent.

Speaking of independence, I hope you are noticing how proficient these kids are becoming at putting on their own coats. I am so proud of each of them! Children can get frustrated when they always need to ask for help, so this is one skill that they can perform by themselves with practice. Please encourage your child to dress him/or herself when leaving home. (Prints and solids look lovely together, don't they? I heard that is this season's fashion statement!) Allow a little extra time, if you can, so that they can show off their new skills. They are all doing a great job!!! Zippering a coat is also within reach of this age group...so we're encouraging it, too! Some in the gang have already conquered this skill...and are now busy helping their friends get ready to go outside.

Calendar time is a favorite time of day...the kids are really getting into counting and figuring out the monthly pattern. Patterning is such an important pre-math skill. So when your child is looking for something to do one day, give them a handful of buttons, or coins, or whatever is handy...and ask them to make a pattern. We make it fun at school...bet you can, too! ☺

The Monday gang will continue their march through the alphabet with Letters W(1/9), D(1/23), and B(1/30). You should hear this group as they put the letter sounds to use...their prereading skills are starting to emerge! And they are having lots of FUN doing it! Plus every member of this gang can write their name...an awesome achievement! I am so proud of each one of them!

WOW...what a month! As usual, if anyone has any concerns or questions concerning your child, please don't hesitate to call me at home. You know how I love to tell you how terrific and special your little one is! I'm looking forward to conferences! ☺ Stay tuned...

January... a month that usually has me longing for warmth and a beach somewhere. Whatever the weather might be outside though, in the 4s room we'll be having fun all month long.

The first week back from break, we'll be headed out of town and off this planet, **Out in Space**. Scientific inquiries and our imaginations will be exercised this week. We'll be discussing gravity- can something exist even if we don't see it? We'll also be doing some creative writing as we think up some great space adventures. Counting planets and stars will also be part of the fun. The Letter of the Week will be R and we'll be dancing to *Rocket ship Run* and "launching" a hydraulic-powered moon rocket.

The week of January 10th, we're talking **Winter Fun**. How do we have fun in the cold and snow? What do we do to keep warm? The week of Jan 17<sup>th</sup> starts our two week focus on **Dinosaurs**. We'll use graphs to compare dinosaurs, talk about what we know, wonder and learned about dinosaurs, and we'll have some active games to play. We'll also talk about how the Earth was different when the dinosaurs lived and hopefully write a creative class story for our library. Paleontology will be one of the many big words we learn these two weeks. Maybe we'll even use some excavating skills ourselves. The Letter of the Week will be D for "dinosaur" of course! **No school Friday, Jan 20<sup>th</sup>.**

Keep sending in those hats, warm coats and fuzzy mittens. We do try to go outside most days and your children are getting very independent at putting on their own coats, hats and gloves. We're remembering to ask a friend to help us zip *before* asking a grown-up and the children love to be able to help each other out.

**Please try and put a label on each article of outerwear so we can return misplaced pieces to their rightful owners.**

Stay tuned for information about the "small group activity rotation" we'll be starting once a week in January as well as information about Conference Sign Ups. Volunteering to help with our Open House this month is a great way to earn volunteer hours and it is especially helpful to have our veteran parents assist with the tours. 
